**Here are some guidelines for support:**

Financial support for events, programs, and organizational overhead. The suggested financial commitment to PMC is on a fair share basis depending on the size of the Member Congregation:

- 1 – 50 faith house members = \$250.
- 50 – 100 members = \$300
- 100 – 500 members = \$400 - \$500
- 500 – 1,000 members = \$750;
- over 1,000 members = \$1,000

If needed, there should be a willingness to provide funds for certain events and programs on a fair share basis. Fair share amounts may change in the future. If a Member Congregation is financially unable to make suggested contributions it will not be denied membership if fully participating in other ways.
